Transport to and from school

It is the parent/caregiver's responsibility to secure car seats into the vehicle, buckle children into their eats and to receive the child at the end of the day. Drivers contracts state that they are not allowed to buckle the children in, so please support them by doing this each day. It is important that there is an adult at home when the child arrives from school. For safety purposes the driver **may not leave** the van as there are other students needing supervision.
